In geography we have been looking at the differences between urban and rural areas and the different reasons people choose to live there. Children are learning about how we can use the sun's energy, wind and water to make electricity and have come up with some great ideas on how we can conserve water and electricity use. In maths, children are having fun changing numbers to Roman numerals and are quickly grasping the rules for this.

It's been a busy and exciting term filled with lots of new learning experiences for our pupils! In geography, we learned all about where we are in the world and explored our local area. We also looked at different types of places where people live, including urban and rural areas, and discovered different natural landscapes like mountains and rivers. In science we learned about the different types of animals like birds, fish, mammals, reptiles, and amphibians. We also learned how animals adapt to where they live and what they need to stay alive. We looked closely at the life cycle of a frog, found out what owls eat, and explored pond life. We even went on a bug hunt in our school grass area, counting all the different bugs we saw.

In maths, we practised different ways to solve word problems and learned about the difference between how much something can hold (capacity) and how heavy something is (weight). In shared reading, we finished reading "The Iron Man" and the children wrote some fantastic stories inspired by it. Some of our Year 3 pupils had an exciting trip to Bury St Edmunds Cathedral.

And finally, we had an amazing sports day where everyone took part in all the races and games. It was great to see everyone having fun and trying their best! We hope you enjoyed hearing about what your child has been learning this term in leappad. We're really proud of all their hard work!

As we reach the end of the school year, our class has continued to enjoy a wide range of exciting and meaningful learning experiences.

In reading, we proudly finished Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone and have now moved on to the captivating adventure story The Girl Who Stole an Elephant. The children have loved getting to know the characters, exploring the settings, and making thoughtful predictions and inferences as the plot unfolds.

In english, we have been focusing on developing our grammar skills and writing for a variety of purposes. From creative stories and character descriptions to letters and instructions, the children have practised structuring their ideas clearly and confidently, while expanding their vocabulary and sentence choices.

Our maths learning this half term has centred on revision and consolidation. We've revisited key areas from across the year, including number work, calculations, time, shape, and fractions, helping to build fluency, boost confidence, and prepare the children for the next stage of their mathematical journey. In geography, we've been exploring the world of maps. The children learned how to read and interpret maps, recognise different symbols, and understand how maps help us make sense of our environment.

Our science topic focused on the environment and evolution. We investigated how animals and plants adapt over time to survive in different habitats. The children particularly enjoyed learning about unusual species and the clever ways they've evolved to thrive in their surroundings.

It has been a fantastic end to a busy and successful year. We are incredibly proud of everything the children have achieved and the enthusiasm they've brought to their learning. A special well done to the three members of LeapPad who are preparing to take the next big step as they move on to secondary school, we know they will continue to shine!





Try new styles and genres of reading materials; books, magazines, gaming manuals, verse novels or comics! There are no fines on late returns for children's books.






ABOUT THE QUEST
